**GIL Intra Moot Court Competition: Rules and Guidelines :**

**1. The Moot court**

The GIL Moot Court society is conducting Intra Moot Court Competition, with the principle objective of promoting better awareness of mootings among students of our college and prepare them for various national and international moot competitions.

**2. Eligibility:**

All students of 1<sup>st</sup> year in BALLB, BBALLB and LLB courses are eligible for participation in the competition.

**3. Team Composition:**

Each team participating in the Competition shall consist of 2 members only.

**4. Language, Dress code and Conduct**

4.1 The official language of the competition shall be English.

4.2 The participants must adhere to standards of conduct and dress as high as those required of a lawyer engaged in practice of law in India, however, use of robes or collars is not required.

**5. Registration:**

Teams who have registered themselves and have received the team codes are eligible for participation. **Teams allotted with Odd no. Code will prepare memorial from Prosecution side only and Teams allotted with even no. code will prepare memorial from Defence side only.**

**6. Memorials:**

**6.1 *Submission of memorials:***

Each participating team shall prepare memorial from the side allotted<sup>1</sup>, in English.

All teams are to submit their copies to the organizers before the deadline specified by

the Moot court Society (MCS). Failure to do so will result in disqualification from the competition. Two copies of memorial from the side allotted, in paper (hard copy) shall be submitted to the MCS. During oral presentations, the participating teams should retain copies of their memorials for their personal use. The copies submitted to the organizing committee will not be returned to the participants under any circumstances. There will be exchange of memorials between the teams during the competition. All memorials shall be prepared to the following specifications:

- Memorial shall not be more than 15 typed pages.
  - Memorials must be typed and submitted on standard A4 size paper.
  - Font and size of the text of all parts of the memorial (excluding footnotes) must be the same and must be in Times New Roman 12 font size.
  - The texts of all parts of each memorial must be double-spaced, with one inch margin on both sides.
  - text of footnotes<sup>2</sup> and headings may be single-spaced. The font size of footnotes must be Times New Roman 10 font size.
  - There must be double spacing between separate footnotes and between each heading and the body text of the memorial.
  - The table of Contents, Index of Authorities and Case Title are not included in the 15 typed pages limit.
- Cover page of the Memorials: Prosecution: Blue and Defence: Red.

6.2 Description of the memorial *The Memorial shall consist of the following parts:*

- Table of Contents
- Index of Authorities (including corresponding page numbers)
- Statement of Jurisdiction
- Identification of Issues
- Statement of Facts
- Summary of Pleadings
- Pleadings including the Conclusion and/or Prayer for Relief.

**7. Oral Rounds:**

- There will be only one round of orals in which teams will plead from their respective sides.<sup>3</sup>
- Each speaker shall plead for 10 minutes.
- 5 mins shall be allotted for rebuttals.
- Extension of time is the sole discretion of judges during the oral rounds.

**8. Criteria for Assessment:**

The assessment of the teams during the Moot Court competition shall be out of a maximum of 100 marks, set out as follows:

- Written Memorials: 30 Marks.
- Appreciation of Fact and Law: 15 Marks
- Advocacy (Arguments, Framing of Issues, expression and articulation): 30 Marks
- Use of Authorities and Citations: 15 Marks
- General Impression and Court Manner: 10 Marks
- The late submission of memorials will attract a penalty of 2 marks per hour being deducted from the total marks allocated for memorials.

- Best Female Advocate
- Best memorial

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## MOOT PROPOSITION

Dr. Joey is a well established surgeon in Geeta Hospital, Panipat. He is a heart specialist and had got many awards for his remarkable work in the field of medicine. He had a cousin, Mr. Chandler, who was his regular patient at the hospital.

Chandler got unwell and called Dr. Joey to visit him. Meanwhile he advised Chandler to get some tests done at the nearby FRIENDS lab.

Dr. Joey visited him in the evening and checked the reports. Chandler was diagnosed as a NYHA CLASS IV patient. He suffered from breathlessness, chest pain and had been previously diagnosed with diabetes, hypertension. Dr. Joey recommended to undergo CABG (Coronary Artery Bypass Graft) surgery. All the risks and complications of the surgery were explained to him and necessary consent obtained thereafter. Chandler requested for the surgery to be conducted at Dr. Joey's place in his temporary clinic. Dr. Joey was against it, however after strong persuasion, he agreed.

Dr. Joey had almost all the equipments required for the surgery that he had recently purchased as he had planned to start his own private clinic. He hired a nurse, Monica, for assistance. The surgery was successful and he was wheeled out into post operational care at his own residence under supervision of Monica guided by Dr. Joey.

During recovery condition, Chandler's position deteriorated. Monica took the necessary care, but she couldn't handle the situation and his health worsened. She tried calling Dr. Joey but he was busy in the hospital and didn't answer her call. Chandler developed blisters all over his body which eventually resulted in being gangrenous, due to his past diabetic history. This resulted in amputation of his certain fingers and toes.

On a later examination it was found that the condition of Chandler had deteriorated because of a sudden drop in his body temperature, which although was a normal post op complication, but due to past diabetic record of the patient had exaggerated to this extent.

Now, Chandler has brought an action against Dr. Joey and Monica for Negligence, breach of duty and claim damages for loss of livelihood.
